

Duinoord Neighbourhood Agenda 2021-2024

This neighbourhood agenda has been drawn up with the help of residents, the Duinoord Residents' Foundation ("Stichting Bewonersoverleg Duinoord"), entrepreneurs, the municipality of The Hague and other partners. 800 residents have completed a questionnaire to indicate their priorities for the neighbourhood agenda. The neighbourhood agenda presents seven themes that we will be working on together over the next four years.

LIVING TOGETHER

Social cohesion is important to residents. Many residents are willing to get involved in the neighbourhood, or to step up their involvement.

Actions:

- Encourage locals and expats to come together.
- Enhance the engagement of neighbourhood residents.
- Welcome new residents.

Who are involved: Duinoord Residents' Foundation, expats, locals, Municipality of The Hague

A CLEAN DISTRICT

Residents are annoyed at litter being placed next to underground residual waste containers (ORACs).

Actions:

- Address littering next to ORACs and recruit ORAC adopters.

Who are involved: Duinoord Residents' Foundation, Municipality of The Hague

TRAFFIC

Residents report a range of traffic related concerns including speeding, parking and noise pollution from motorised vehicles.

Actions:

- Investigate possibilities to improve traffic safety in a number of streets and intersections.
- Start exploring car-sharing options.
- Start exploring a neighbourhood-based approach to cycling, shared bicycles/scooters.

SHOPPING STREETS

Many residents have indicated that they consider Reinkenstraat to be important as a shopping street.

Actions:

- District council and shop-keepers' association to work together more closely.

Who are involved: Duinoord Residents' Foundation, Vereniging BIZ (BIZ Association), Winkelgebied Reinkenstraat (Reinkenstraat Shopping Area), Municipality of The Hague

SUSTAINABILITY

Many Duinoord residents are committed - or want to start committing themselves - to becoming more sustainable. There is a demand for more information on what the possibilities are (NL and EN).

Actions:

- Educate: guide residents through the energy transition and inform them of the options (what they can do themselves) to make their homes more sustainable.
- Inspire: let residents see and experience that energy can be saved and gained by joining forces as a neighbourhood.
- Activate: help residents to take real steps together to make their homes more sustainable and thus contribute to a future-ready Duinoord.

Who are involved: Duinoord Residents' Foundation, Municipality of The Hague

GREENERY

Residents have identified greening as the major topic for the neighbourhood agenda.

Actions:

- Continue to work on the preservation and maintenance of green spaces.
- Inform and activate residents to become involved in greening up their own neighbourhood.
- Implementation of the Sweelinckplein improvement plan ("Sweelinckplein fleurt op").

Who are involved: Duinoord Residents' Foundation, Stichting vrienden van het Sweelinckplein (Friends of Sweelinckplein Foundation), Municipality of The Hague

PLAYGROUND

Many residents have expressed a wish for more playgrounds for children in the neighbourhood in addition to the existing ones.

Actions:

- Find a suitable site for a new playground and take the steps needed to that end.
- Get residents involved in the layout of the playground.
